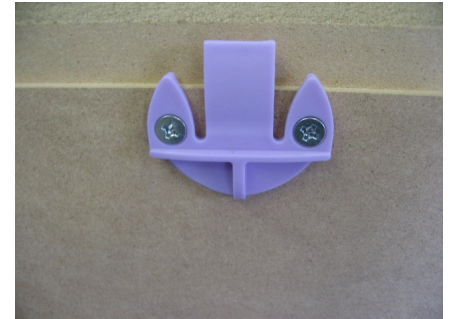


Mitre Corner

Stealth Chicago + Pagoda Corner
On ICE and ready to go.



Clean and to the Point

It was one of those head slapping moments: DIRTT Solid Wall skins run off-module, so why not come up with a corner condition where the skins meet up for a smooth, clean aesthetic? The Product Development Team did just that with the new Mitre Corner. While they were at it, they came up with a way to keep the Antler on task when meeting that corner.

The corner itself is designed with what is best described as a half-Chicago post called a **Stealth Chicago**. The Antler extender fits inside the post and is attached to the post and frames - it is called The **Pagoda Corner**. Now that they can create a corner, the skins come with some self-protection added in. The left-hand skins have a lovely, smooth, thin extrusion running along the lip to make up half the corner, with the skin clipping on the frame in the usual way. The right-hand skin has a new clip for a clip n' slide ability. The skin slides into place creating a very nice aesthetic behind the new extrusion lip on the other skin.

- Creates elegant 90 degree corner
- Clean continuation of Antler detail with the Pagoda Corner
- Keeps original product philosophy intact
- Thin extrusion protects the skins from damage at corner point
- Retrofittable
- Post behind skins based on half-Chicago - The Stealth Chicago
- Finishes: painted and veneer. Back-painted glass TBA
